6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures: Wear compatible, chemically resistant gloves. Use personal protective equipment. Avoid breathing dust. Material can create slippery conditions. Remove all sources of ignition. Ensure adequate ventilation.

Environmental precautions: CAUTION: Keep spills and cleaning runoff out of municipal sewers and open bodies of water.

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up: Sweep up and shovel into suitable containers for disposal. Use water spray to keep dusting to a minimum.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for safe handling: Do not breathe dust. Do not breathe vapors, mist or gas. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Ground all metal containers during storage and handling. Ensure adequate ventilation. Keep container tightly closed.

Conditions for safe storage: Store in original container. Avoid temperature extremes during storage; ambient temperature preferred. Keep away from heat, sparks, flame, and other sources of ignition. **Other data:** Avoid high concentrations of dust in air and accumulation of dust on equipment. An airborne dust of this material can create a dust explosion. When handling and processing this material local exhaust ventilation may be required to control dust and reduce exposure to vapors. These findings were consistent with high concentration exposure effects reported for other non-soluble dusts. Maintaining airborne dust concentrations within the recommended exposure limit is not expected to produce adverse effects within the lung.
